Minutes of 18th Annual General Meeting of the National Association of Boat Owners held on 21st November 2009 at WOLVERHAMPTON BOAT CLUB.

Present: David Fletcher, Chairman, Richard Carpenter, General Secretary, Stephen Peters, Treasurer and four other members of Council plus 40 members.

Apologies for absence

Received from Andy Colyer, Ellen Dades, Tony Haynes, Louis Jankel, Julie Pittilla, Gordon Jamieson, Alan Richards, Simon Robbins, Mr Worthington.

<u>Minutes</u>

The minutes of the 16th AGM held at Stafford Boat Club were distributed and were proposed by Howard Anguish and seconded by Peter Brooks and with all those that were present in favour were accepted as a true record. The Chairman signed the minutes.

Chairman's report

David firstly thanked Stuart Sampson, previous Chairman, for his final year on Council now that he was finally standing down to follow his dream in Europe. He outlined how supportive Stuart had been with his help and advice during the past year and for his continued Editorship of NABO News. A vote of thanks was proposed by Stephen Peters and seconded by Howard Anguish. As small presentation was made to Stuart to acknowledge the length of service is various capacities - not forgetting the help given by his wife Carole.

David ran through some of the main issues he and Council had been working on and remarked on how similar when tracking back over past minutes and issues of NABO News they remained.

Council had worked on

- the latest Moorings Consultation lead by Howard Anguish
- preparing in some detail for a legal challenge to BW led by Geoffrey Rogerson
- responding and discussing the 2020 vision from BW

- · the boating Survey results led by John Slee
- as well as many support issues around the system.

He asked General Secretary, Richard Carpenter to provide the meeting with an outline of Councils activities which were as follows:

Council Members attended 170 meetings throughout the country representing NABO with a further 56 private meetings on behalf of members with British Waterways, the Environment Agency and others.

Council members had received and dealt with just over 300 letters which required response, with a further 80 specifically from members requiring advice.

The Hon Secretary dealt with 1500 E mails relating to NABO so it can be assumed that a good proportion of that number will have also been received and worked on by other Council Members.

He estimated that between 4000 and 5000 hours would have been spent at meetings, in travel and privately on NABO by the combined Council during the year.

We had an 82% attendance of Council members at our 7 meetings which are held at Oldbury in the West Midlands.

Financial Statement

The accounts had been distributed to the members present and it was noted that the Association remains in very good health.

Membership Fees were slightly down during the year but donations had increased which pretty much offset this. The main area of increased costs was the growing number of meetings called at which stakeholders needed to attend - resulting in increased travel.

The treasurer reminded the meeting that Council Members gave their time free of charge and only travel costs were provided.

The treasurer did indicate that there will be an increase in legal costs this coming year as the challenge goes ahead but that funds were robust enough for this. The Treasurers report was proposed by David Fletcher and seconded by John Slee followed by an unanimous vote.

Annual Subscription fees

In line with tradition the treasurer stated that he would resign if the membership fees were to change, pointing out that as he had reported the finances were robust. He therefore proposed, seconded by Carole Sampson that there would be no change. All present were in favour.

Appointment of the auditor

Stephen Peters explained that the present auditor is prepared to continue in 2009/2010. He therefore proposed, seconded by Richard Carpenter that Alan David be NABO's Auditor - all were in favour.

Election of Council Members

Nine people are standing for council namely Howard Anguish, Sue Burchett, Richard Carpenter, Andy Colyer, David Fletcher, Stephen Peters, Geoffrey Rogerson, Simon Robbins and John Slee.

There being no need for an election the Chairman asked the meeting if it was happy to elect them en bloc. All were in favour prposed by Stuart Sampson and seconded by and seconded by Sadie Dean. The nine were elected to Council for the year 2009-2010.

With the formal part of the meeting over there was an hour of lively questions and opinions from the floor. These included concerns about what a new government would doing terms of the increasing worries about funding with a General Election due within months. Most were pessimistic but urged Council to press as hard as possible to get the message over about boaters concerns. Quite a lot of discussion surrounding our legal challenge which was explained in more detail by David Fletcher specifically regarding roving mooring permits and the interpretation of the various BW Acts. The main objective was to obtain clarification and try to ensure the future rules are followed by BW and not allow then to do just as they want which is the fear.

John Slee then presented his preliminary findings from the Boaters Survey and provided notes to those present. He arranged for computers to to be running through lunch that outlined his finding as well. These will also be available on the new web site. He was thanked by the Chairman for the many hours of effort that went into providing the analysis.

The new council broke for a brief Council meeting to discuss roles and the following were agreed:-

David Fletcher to continue as Chairman, Richard Carpenter as Secretary, and Stephen Peters as Treasurer with other roles to be decided at the first full council meeting.

Following a nice lunch provided by members of the Wolverhampton Boat Club all enjoyed an interesting presentation from Richard Fairhurst, Editor of Waterways World which was followed by questions and further debate on issues surrounding the Waterways and Boat Owning. Richard was presented with some liquid refreshments to take away in recognition of his generous time in attending.

Financial Control Issue from previous Audits

The financial control issue concerning stocks held in the Central Store now appears to have been addressed. This issue concerned the verification of the physical stock with the accounting records. Financial Control Issues - 2009 Audit
